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Using the Ling Sound Test with ADHEAR

The Ling sound test is used to check that an individual has access to sounds across the full speech spectrum.

Detection: The individual indicates a sound is heard Identification: The individual repeats the sound or points to a card

Directions

- 1. Individuals using ADHEAR for unilateral hearing loss, block, (as best possible) normal hearing ear
- 2. Say each sound, one at a time, and in no particular order. Use a normal speaking volume. Remove all lipreading and visual cues.
- 3. Check distance hearing by delivering the sounds from 2-3 meters away.
- 4. Adjust volume if required.
- 5. Document the results.

() = If the wrong sound is repeated back, the person administering the test should write the sound produced. (e.g. if the sound presented is "sh" and the individual using ADHEAR says "s", write "s" in the box.



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
